Please make sure you have read the assignment descriptions and have noted the deadlines with your child. Once you have done that, please sign and date this form below, and have it returned to school. You can keep the first two pages (Country Project Timeline, Special Project Description, Country Project Calendar) for your own records.

The following information has been discussed with the students at school, but it is also important that you review these important points with your child before they start their project:

- It is important to schedule and plan your work; work a little bit at a time and don't get too far behind.
- If a student finishes a part of the project early, they are encouraged to hand it in early for feedback. This will give the students more time to work on other parts of the project.
- Research consists of a yellow package with a series of questions and a white research chart.
- Research will be handed back to the students as soon as possible to ensure that they have enough time to work on the final report, so please make sure the research is completed on time.
- When completing the final report, students are encouraged to write a paragraph for each section of the report. There should be enough time for the student to work on 1 or 2 paragraphs every day for homework (and therefore avoid a panicky rush at the end).
- If students choose to do a food dish as part of their special project, then there will be a class food fair scheduled on the due date of the special project (in this case \_\_\_\_\_)
